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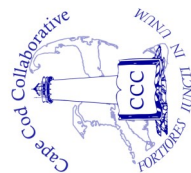

Providing services for students attending the Cape Cod Collaborative school-year program and referrals from member district programs

The S.T.A.R. Extended School Year (ESY) program provides a structured day focused on maintaining skills for students who receive a high level of services during their regular school-year program.

The program offers high teacher-student ratios, therapy services, and supports including consultation by a BCBA & clinical staff.

All referrals for the Extended School Year program must come from a student's sending school district.

The S.T.A.R. ESY program supports students attending our year-round program, as well as other students referred from their sending district.

Our educational setting provides a structured environment. Programs incorporate a foundation of Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) and Positive Behavior Supports (PBS) into teaching and arrangement of the environment. Our Public Day School places an emphasis on building independence and encouraging participation in all facets of a student's day; activities focus on functional life skills and activities of daily living. ESY incorporates instruction and opportunities to maintain academic, social, therapy and behavioral skills and expectations.
