DISTRICT DATA PLANS

Building District Data Teams

The Center for Professional Development will facilitate 5-6 meetings of district Data Teams. The basic goal of the meetings will be to develop a usable District Data Plan by the end of the 2011-2012 school year. Opportunities for targeted sharing and learning will be a critical part of the networking.

The development of the data plans will evolve from inter-district discussions and sharing of resources that will align with 3 basic data planning constructs: Quality, Capacity and Culture. The overarching goal will be to make teacher/administrator use of student growth data relevant and user-friendly at the district, school and classroom level.

The first meeting of this networking group will take place in September at the Cape Cod Collaborative (Osterville).

ALL CAPE IN-SERVICE DAY - OCTOBER 7, 2011

The All Cape In-service Day has been moved from a January venue to a Fall venue. This school year's event will take place on **October 7, 2011**. The In-Service Day will continue to offer workshops and trainings for specialists from the instructional areas of art, music, health/PE, OT/PT, special education, nursing, library/media and administration.

Category 1 ELL - Training Last Week in June

Description: "An Introduction to Second Language Learning and Teaching" (DESE Model-SEI Category 1). This training curriculum has been developed in partnership with the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education.

The training is designed as an introduction to assist teachers of English Language Learners at the intermediate level of English proficiency or higher in delivering instruction that is optimally "sheltered" for these students, while still promoting their ongoing development of English.

This is a two (2) day training for a maximum of 25 teachers. \$180 per student

Data Warehouse Basics and More - June 29, 2011 - Bourne High School

This workshop for new Data Warehouse users will combine the essential elements of the DW101 and DW201 courses from the ESE, including the cycle of inquiry and use of the pre-defined reports. The new Student Growth Model and related reports will also be explored. While sample data will be used for the introductory activities, participants will have the opportunity to begin to investigate data for their own schools/districts.

Data Warehouse Refresher Course - August 22, 2011 - Bourne High School

This session is intended for staff who have had previous Data Warehouse training (or have explored it independently) but need additional support in the use of this tool. The workshop will provide a structured environment in which to explore data using the pre-defined reports in the Data Warehouse, including the new Growth Model and reports. Participants will access their own district or school's data, get time-saving tips and will have an opportunity to run and save reports for use in the planning for the 2011-2012 school year.

LITERACY TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES

Literacy training opportunities available. The training will be provided by Keys To Literacy consultants . The focus of the training is on “content literacy grades 4-8”. Three (3) different trainings will be offered:

The Key Three Comprehension Routine integrates reading, writing and study strategies using existing content reading materials. The program is used in any content area by all teachers (Tier I instruction). It is also used as supplemental comprehension instruction for struggling readers by interventionists (Tier II instruction).

The Key Vocabulary Routine integrates research-based vocabulary instruction into content learning. It includes direct and indirect methods for teaching academic language across the content areas and discipline-specific vocabulary. The program is used in any content area by all teachers (Tier I instruction). It is also used as supplemental vocabulary instruction for struggling readers by interventionists (Tier II instruction). The routine includes these five steps: previewing vocabulary before reading, selecting specific words to teach in-depth, using activities for teaching words in relation to other words (semantic mapping, semantic feature analysis, categorizing, scaling), use of context and word parts, and word consciousness in the classroom .

The ANSWER Key to Open Response is a one-day training for teachers to teach students a routine to answer open response questions. Several skills from the Key Three and Key Vocabulary routines (e.g., question skills and vocabulary, two-column notes) are taught so students can apply their reading comprehension, organization, and writing skills to generate open response answers that reflect their literacy skills. Can be used by classroom teachers (Tier I instruction). Can also be used as supplemental instruction for struggling readers by interventionists (Tier II instruction). The steps in the routine:

Analyze the question

Note plan

Skim, read and select

Write the response

End by Reviewing

UNLEASHING THE POWER of COLLABORATIVE INQUIRY: A PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM for DATA COACHES

Description: Learn about a structured process of collaborative inquiry that is increasing professional community, effective uses of data, and student achievement in schools across the country. The approach features the development of Data Coaches, school and district leaders who guide data teams through a process of 1) building a foundation; 2) identifying a student learning problem; 3) verifying causes of student learning problems; 4) generating and monitoring solutions; and 5) achieving results.

Through this program, Data Coaches learn how to lead a process of collaborative inquiry with school-based data teams and to influence the culture of schools to be one in which data are used continuously, collaboratively and effectively to improve teaching and learning. The program is based on the resource, *A Data Coach's Guide to Improving Learning for All Students: Unleashing the Power of Collaborative Inquiry* (Corwin Press, 2008), by Nancy Love, Katherine E. Stiles, Susan Mundry, and Kathryn DiRanna.
